Fred Schaeffer writes: “December 2009 marked the 10th anniversary of what has become one of my most vivid memories, almost equal to the memories I have of Austin High! I had long been involved in independent study in the fields of genocide studies and religious thought, and was invited to participate in the Parliament of the World's Religions, convened at Cape Town, South Africa, December 1-8, 1999. SILVER SNEAKERS:

Exercise? Who, Me? Can't find a class at the right time of day? Don't want to exercise with all those young people? For example, by entering "60015" (Deerfield, IL) the list includes classes in: Deerfield, Mount Prospect, Libertyville, Des Plaines, Morton Grove, Nilus, Skokie, and Waukegan. Within 15 miles of our zip code in Minnesota there are twenty-one options. So, take advantage of this great resource to lower your health risks and get physically fit! MUSIC MEMORIES: THE ONE HIT WONDERS OF THE FIFTIES (by Chuck Meyer):

Nobody answered the prior question correctly. - the song was "Sh-Boom" It was written and recorded, by the Chords in early 1954. By the end of June 1954, this song had climbed up the charts nationwide, charting on both the R&B (number three) and Pop (number nine) lists, a nearly unprecedented feat for its time. After their recording became popular, they ran into a legal dispute over the name Chords, so they changed it to the ShBooms, but to no avail. They disbanded until the 1980's, when four of the quintet members had a "reunion" where they sang their hit. See this performance video at: <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=wp2IyWM4ycc>.

The Crew Cuts then recorded this song - with the Ya-da-da-da-da-da that became their signature. It was number one on the Billboard charts for nine weeks during August and September of 1954. This is the version that most of us remember. Hear it at: <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=AqWqFLzGLi8>.

WELL ACTUALLY... *Jim Padar* knew the answer, but failed to submit it prior to reading the first draft of this newsletter. Sorry, Jim - you can't bet the race after the horses cross the finish line. Jim was on Stage Crew and, if you remember, prior to our home games at Hanson Park, they would pipe the latest hits of the day into the PA system. Do you recall the one bar total silence breaks in the Crew Cuts version? Jim was the joker who grabbed the edge of the record and turned it into a four bar break, thus producing an entire student body that thought they suffered a petit mal seizure in the fall of 1954.

But now let's meet our next mystery one-hit wonder. She speaks fluently in six languages, and has recorded over 1300 albums in 12 languages. She was probably the first international girl pop singing star, a bigger hit overseas than in the US. She performed on TV shows hosted by Danny Kaye, Perry Como, Bing Crosby, Gordon MacRae, and Dean Martin; and on similar shows in many other countries. She has performed with Louis Armstrong, Benny Goodman, and Ella Fitzgerald. So how could such a singer be a one-hit-wonder?? Let her tell you about it.

"I was born in Paris in 1931, of Italian parents who were in the circus. So I, as a child, also worked in the circus. Singing and performing became my life. I even saw one of your Austin classmates in the audience in 1966 when I did a concert at Tivoli Gardens in Copenhagen. My first three singles were international hits, but only one was a hit in the US (it was the only one in English). The song reached its highest on the charts (#13) around the time of your graduation. After that, I recorded only albums. Because of that, I had only one hit single in the US. So, I'm a one-hit-wonder on a technicality."
