IN MEMORIAM – CLASS OF 1955:

Lolita (Quiny) Fraser passed away mid-December 2016 after a two-year battle with ovarian cancer. We extend our heartfelt sympathy to her husband Don and the Quiny and Fraser families.

Dr. Monique (Lopas) Savlin, PhD beloved wife of the late Robert, loving mother of Peter, Eric, and David (Becky), passed away on January 12. Monique was born in Antwerp, Belgium, and had a happy childhood until the Occupation. She then lived with a Catholic family in the countryside, pretending to be Catholic. Her father, Aaron, was killed by Nazis. After the war, the family immigrated to Chicago, where she met future husband Robert on a blind date, since he had studied in Belgium. She taught French at Chute Middle School in Evanston, then earned her Ph.D. at Northwestern, and was a practicing psychologist for the rest of her life. "I became a psychologist, looking into the mind to find meaning and attempting to understand how people came to behave in the many varied ways which they do. What makes us truly human? How can we be so different from each other? What drives some to commit evil and deny wrongdoing?" Rest in Peace, Monique.

Arlene (Cohen) Lavin passed away peacefully with all of her family around her on February 24, in Scottsdale, AZ. Mel and Ross became fast friends, and Mel served as an advisor and later volunteered for nearly 40 years with the Siragusa's nonprofit family foundation. Although settled on the West Coast, Mel never let go of his Chicago roots, remaining loyal to all the Chicago sports teams, especially the Bears and Cubs. Mel is remembered as an energetic, patient, and thoughtful person, with an admirable sense of humor and diplomacy, and a wonderful penchant for story-telling.

2016 ANNIVERSARY CORRECTION:

Thanks to **Maxine Jaffee** for pointing out some errors in the Winter newsletter's article about radio station WFMT. The station moved in **1964**, not 1954, to its current location at 5400 N. St. Louis Avenue. This facility was renamed in **2014**, not 1995, the Renée Crown Public Media Center.

CHICAGO'S OLDEST BAR CLOSES:

Long considered one of the city's most historic taverns, Schaller's Pump opened in 1881 and poured its last beer on April 30, 2017. The bar took "Pump" as part of its name because of the brewery next door pumping beer directly into the tavern. George Schaller bought it near the end of Prohibition. His son, Jack, took over in the early 1960s and ran the bar for decades with the help of his children. Jack Schaller, who lived in an apartment above the bar, died in 2016. It was a short walk from the former home of Richard J. Daley and across the street from the 11th Ward Democratic headquarters.

2017 BIRTHDAYS AND ANNIVERSARIES:

225 YEARS AGO: on April 2, 1792, Congress established the first U.S. Mint in Philadelphia.

208 YEARS AGO: Abraham Lincoln was born in Hodgenville, Kentucky. Little known facts about him are: he was a licensed bartender; he was a wrestler who lost only one of his 300 matches, and was posthumously honored in the National Wrestling Hall of Fame; he hated the nickname "Abe." [*Parade*, February 12, 2017]

145 YEARS AGO: Arbor Day was founded by J. Sterling Morton on April 10, in Nebraska City, Nebraska, where over an estimated one million trees were planted on that single day.

125 YEARS AGO: Walt Whitman passed peacefully at home on March 26, 1892, after a career that revolutionized American literature with works like *The Leaves of Grass*.

100 YEARS AGO: John F. Kennedy was born in Brookline, Massachusetts on May 29, 1917. He served as President of the United States from 1961-1963, in the U.S. Senate from 1953-1960 and in the U.S. House of Representatives from 1947-1953. He died on 11-22-63. The U.S. entered World War I on April 6, 1917.

80 YEARS AGO: Madeleine Korbel Albright, was born Marie Jana Korbel on May 15, 1937, in Prague, Czechoslovakia (now the Czech Republic). Her grandmother gave her the nickname "Madeleine." She married Joseph Medill Patterson Albright three days after graduating from Wellesley. They had three daughters. She became the first woman to be sworn in as the United States Secretary of State on January 23, 1997.

80 YEARS AGO: On May 27, members of the public first walked across the Golden Gate Bridge on the day of its completion. Cars crossed the next day.

DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME (DST) MYTH:

Most Americans think we turn our clocks one hour forward in the spring and backward in the fall because the farmers said they needed more daylight in the field. The truth is it was industrialists and politicians, including Woodrow Wilson, who thought that increasing daylight hours would reduce demand for electricity and free up coal for the war effort, according to David Prerau, author of *Seize the Daylight*. Questions remain if DST does, in fact, reduce energy consumption to a significant degree, but it HAS succeeded in getting more people to shop. The extra month of DST that the U.S. began observing in 1986, boosted the golf and BBQ industries by between \$200 million and \$400 million, according to some estimates. That trend continues for many retailers today. [TIME 3-20-17]
